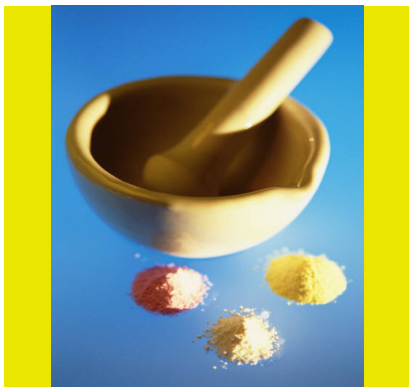

Program Descriptions and Learning Objectives

Compounding 101: Taking Your Business to the Next Level through Analysis and Innovation

This program will provide pharmacy owners and employees with tools to take their compounding business to a higher level of financial and professional performance. Many owners run their business, successfully, on a day-to-day basis drawing on experience and intuition. This program will demonstrate how investing the time and energy to develop a well thought out plan will increase their compounding business. Examples of external market and internal business analysis will be given, in addition to specific details of creating a strength-based marketing strategy. Recognizing market forces and reacting quickly to opportunities and threats can influence your bottom line will be presented. Attendees will hear and see real examples of improving a compounding practice.

2. Explain how to access data for an external and internal analysis (demographics, competitors, current mix).
3. Define the elements of a SWOT analysis and how to go about completing one.
4. Develop marketing strategies based on competitive strengths and innovation.
5. Create a goal-based budget.
6. Access resources to improve your business performance and personal skill sets.

New Compounding Regulations

New compounding regulations in California became effective in July 2010. This program will provide guidance to compounding pharmacists on how to stay in compliance with these new regulations, including an understanding of integrity, potency, quality and strength, what policies and procedures will be required, what written documentation board inspectors will be reviewing and what information should be included in a compounding pharmacy's quality assurance plan.

1. Recall the definition of integrity, potency, quality and strength as it relates to pharmacy compounding.
2. Identify what policies and procedures are required by the Board of Pharmacy for pharmacies compounding drug products.
3. Explain what written documentation is required for maintenance of equipment and the facility for safe and accurate compounding of drug products.
4. Explain what is included in a written quality assurance plan to monitor and ensure integrity, potency, quality and labeled strength of compound drug products.

Sterile Compounding: A Review of Current USP <797> Guidelines and Practical Applications for Safe Compounding

The review of USP <797> guidelines and practical applications intend to educate pharmacist and technicians on how to implement clean-room principles and practices that comply with USP <797>. Topics covered include historical review of compounding guidelines and regulations, categories of sterile compounding, clean room physical design and layout, environmental monitoring, quality assurance testing, media fill testing and principles associated with continuous quality improvement. Attendees completing this program will understand the principles of USP <797> related to compounding, documentation, cleaning, monitoring, staff training and facility compliance.

At the conclusion of this presentation, the participant will be able to:

1. Review current content of USP <797> and describe conditions to safely compound sterile preparations.
2. Describe the responsibilities of compounding personnel related to sterile compounding with emphasis on training and documentation.
3. Comprehend environmental monitoring for viable and non-viable particulates.
4. Develop a comprehensive quality assurance program for sterile compounded preparations.
5. Develop and integrate a continuous quality improvement program for properly compounded products.

Compounding for Pain: The Basics and Adjunctive Approaches

During the course of this program we will discuss the various types of pain and their origins. Since more than one type of pain can co-exist in a patient, compounders should be aware of their patients' pain quality and be familiar with good evaluation skills. A special Pain Assessment Tool will be discussed. Once a patient's pain is thoroughly and expertly assessed by a nurse or a physician, a compounding pharmacist should be familiar with the various active ingredients that make up an effective transdermal pain gel or cream, the minimal effective concentrations of each active and the most effective transdermal bases to deliver the active ingredients through the skin. Additionally, a variety of nutraceutical, nutritional and lifestyle approaches that augment pain therapy and their mechanisms of action will be discussed.

2. Identify which pain medications (narcotics, NSAID, muscle relaxants, neuroleptic, etc.) are appropriate for the various types of pain.
3. List the usual starting concentrations of the various active ingredients.
4. Describe the common penetration enhancers used in transdermal pain gels/creams.
5. Identify adjunctive, nutritional, nutraceutical and lifestyle approaches that synergize with transdermal pain medications.
